1. REVIEW

What was your favorite memory from the holiday season?

Read Nehemiah 13:14-31. What is Nehemiah so upset about? Why was the compromise of the people such a big deal?

How does Nehemiah respond to the people? Do you think this would be considered acceptable or controversial in our culture?

2. ASSESS

Nehemiah couldn't stand for any compromise before God; He wanted God to remember him for more. Evaluate your own life. Where have you been compromising in areas that God has commanded?

3. APPLY

Repentance is the way we actively turn from our mistakes and turn toward God. What practical steps will you take this week to actively repent? Who will hold you accountable?
